





Trey Holleway graduated from the Texas Department of Public Safety All Service Recruit School in June of 1994 and was stationed in Magnolia, Montgomery County, as a State Trooper with the Highway Patrol. In July of 1994, Laurie and Trey welcomed their first son, George IV. Trey would later transfer to La Grange in Fayette County and then to his hometown of Brenham in Washington County where in September of 1997, they welcomed their first daughter, Margaret.

During his time as a Highway Patrol Trooper, his main focus was Traffic Enforcement and he completed Level I, Level II, and Level III Crash Investigation schools. The concept of Criminal Interdiction was relatively new when Trey was a Trooper, but he was intrigued to learn the indicators and techniques used by smugglers to transport drugs, illegal currency, and stolen property on our highways. Efforts eventually lead to success in finding concealed loads of illegal contraband.

Trey became proficient at conducting Driving While Intoxicated investigations and his efforts were recognized by the Montgomery County Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Chapter and The Texas District and County Attorneys Association. As a result, Trey was selected by his chain of command to attend Drug Recognition Expert Training which is a specialized skill set to aid in the investigation of an intoxicated driver who is impaired on a substance other than alcohol.

Trey served as a Field Training Officer for several new Troopers and he was a member of the District Civil Disturbance Management Team to suppress and prevent riots.

In 1998, Trey received Officer of the Year Honors from the Washington County Council.
